Sweet Home Football Black Lion Award

- Black Lion Award. This is a very special award sponsored by Jerry Farnsworth (SHHS class of 87). Jerry is a West Point graduate and presently a Lieutenant Colonel in the Army.
- . The qualifications are listed follow.
 - Dedicated to the memory of Don Holleder and the men of the 28th Infantry. The Black Lions who gave their lives for their country in the Battle of Ong Thanh, Vietnam, on October 17,1967. This award is presented to that football player who best exemplifies the character of Don Holleder: leadership, courage, and devotion to duty, selfsacrifice, and above all an unselfish concern for his team ahead of himself. Don Holleder as a West Point cadet was an All -American end as a junior, he was sure to repeat as a senior. But duty called, before his senior year, he was asked by his coach to change positions, and sacrifice any further personal glory, for the sake of his team. He did so willingly and unquestioningly. He made no All-American teams, and in fact he was often criticized, but thanks to his unselfishness, his courage and his leadership, his underdog Army team upset mighty Navy. As an Army officer in Viet Nam, while charging into the jungle to rescue injured comrades, Major Donald W. Holleder was struck and killed by a sniper's bullet. He gave his life for his team and for his teammates.

Each week we select Black Lion Award winners; wear a black practice jersey with Black Lion on back. A Black Lion helmet sticker is also awarded.

Annual award; very prestigious award due to their commitment and many sacrifices to his teammates and his team.
